By direction of the Judge Advocate General, receipt is acknowledged of your letter to the Secretary of War dated 5 June 1947, tendering to the Government of the United States for its use, under the provisions of the act of October 6, 1917, as amended (35 U.S.C. 42), the invention described and claimed in your application for patent, Serial No. 107,244, filed 23 October 1936, for Cryptographs, which application and the invention covered thereby were placed in secrecy by the Commissioner of Patents on 19 May 1947.
