the motorboat, with Margareta

quite a rough trip, with thunder
storm and heavy rain, - visibility
near zero. Out here sun, but
still a little too windy.

She went to visit her mother
in the south of Sweden, and
will come here on the 15th inst,
when Ingrid and Arthur will
leave for the U.S.

She and myself will stay here
until the end of the month,
how long Margareta can stay

and in August Elin will go with me to Frykås.

I will write again before we leave Sweden for Zep & Minnie's. It might interest you to hear that I am planning - if all goes well - to come to the US again in February 1970, for Bob's 50 year anniversary.

I was very sorry to hear that ill health has been plaguing you both again. - I do hope that you both feel better now.

I myself am in good health, my only trouble is with my sleep, but this has not been too severe.

And as for the state of the world, there is nothing else for us individually to be done, but to live from day to day as if everything were O.K. It's cynical, but sane, I think.
