


1. Lt MacDonald of your office inquired as to status of the cases on Richard Hubert BRUCK, Robert Palmer DILWORTH and Luis Walter ALVAREZ. A summary of each case has been prepared by SEC/PERS and is attached.

a. Dr. DILWORTH's case is still pending with the investigative agency. This office requested further investigation to resolve this case for a COMINT clearance decision.

b. FBI reports on Luis ALVAREZ were reviewed. Substance of reports are given in inclosure #2. Although some background information was included in the reports, they were primarily the results of investigations of incidents of loose talk. No personal history statement was available but in view of the attached reports SEC recommended on 26 Mar 53 against further consideration of Prof ALVAREZ for DD of R/D.

c. The Director granted a waiver in Dr. BRUCK's case for a clearance to SECRET; the items to be waived were given in a DF by SEC on 3 Feb 53. A copy of the DF is included in inclosure #3. Investigation of Dr. BRUCK within the continental limits of the U.S. was completed and a clearance through SECRET given on 21 Aug 53.

2. With the exception of Luis ALVAREZ, SEC has been following a previously agreed course of action. Further action was not contemplated except as indicated.





1. This Division is often embarrassed and distressed by the unavoidable delays which are encountered in securing appropriate clearances for subject personnel. Many of the delays are basically the result of insufficient information being provided this office at the inception of a case. We are anxious to do everything possible to expedite actions of this kind and, therefore, present to you herewith certain "Rules" that have to be followed and certain recommendations to accomplish better service.

2. Before any determination or initiation of investigation, requirements that have to be met:

a. Subject meets selection standards prescribed by USCIB #5 (and amendment to SECDEF Memorandum, on Minimum Standards for Cryptographic Clearance, dated 5 June 1952).

b. To determine above, a Personal History Statement is required.

c. Before considering clearance, competent authority for granting the clearance must be determined. The following are "competent authority":

- (1) In the case of persons who are employed by NSA, either on full time or WAE status, the Director.
- (2) In the case of persons who are not paid by NSA, but are in a government or non-government consultant or advisory capacity - USCIB or SECDEF.
- (3) In the case of persons who are working as result of a negotiated contract or under that contract - The Service which is responsible for such negotiation, as follows:
 - (a) The Army - through the Office of the Chief Signal Officer, or the Office of the Chief of Engineers
 - (b) The Navy - through Bureau of Ships
 - (c) The Air Force - No contracts at present

d. Where a person has had a previous clearance, if there has been a break of 18 months in his "need-to-know," a re-opened investigation is required. This means a NEW Personal History Statement and Fingerprints prepared within 60 days of the date the investigation is to be re-opened.

Note: When records of investigation are available, they should be reviewed by SEC to determine "clearability" in accordance with NSA required selection standards - this, sometimes, will avoid the necessity for making up a PHS.

3. Recommended procedure:

a. To the greatest extent possible, the Directorate, P/P, R/D, OPNS, and C/SEC shall provide SEC with a list of the names of individuals who are professionally qualified for NSA needs of this nature. In each case, the name, place of birth (POB) and date of birth (DOB) should be included to aid record identification.

b. SEC will proceed at once to determine:

- (1) Under what jurisdiction the clearance falls - DIR, Service, SECDEF or USCIB. (Requesters will please state whether or not the individual concerned is to be employed by NSA -- full time or WAE -- or to work under contract. If the latter, the Service which has cognizance over the contract).
- (2) Those persons whose current clearance can be certified by DIR for access to NSA information.
- (3) Those persons who previously have been certified by DIR as cleared for access to NSA information.
- (4) Those persons whose records are incomplete but are sufficient to warrant proceeding with clearance processes.
- (5) Those persons whose records indicate ineligibility for clearance.

c. For group b(3) above, if 18 months have elapsed since individual was last granted access, investigation must be re-opened and brought up-to-date; a PHS and Fingerprints are required. If less than 18 months have elapsed, clearance will normally be re-certified at once.

d. For group b(4) above, before additional investigation can be initiated, SEC must have a Personal History Statement and Fingerprint chart executed within 60 days of the date investigation is to be re-opened. Whenever possible, SEC will furnish copies of old PHS's for the individual's use in preparing the new one.

e. Once PHS's and Fingerprint Charts are on hand, SEC will arrange for the re-opening of the investigation to the extent required.

f. With the approval of the department or agency having jurisdiction, the Director is willing to grant interim clearance pending investigation, upon assurance that

- (1) Individual meets selection standards (for this purpose, PHS and Fingerprints are required).
- (2) A satisfactorily evaluated National Agency Check (initiated and evaluated by SEC) has been received by NSA.
- (3) A satisfactorily evaluated interview by means of the polygraph, to which the individual has voluntarily consented, has been accomplished by SEC.



Dear Mr. Beverage:

The National Security Agency, formerly known as the Armed Forces Security Agency, is anxious to be able to call upon eminent scientists such as yourself for part-time services or for special consultation in cryptography and communications research, a field extremely important in the national defense. I assure you that you would be called upon for such services or consultation only on problems of a rather vital nature.

There are three types of problems in which you may be interested. The Agency sponsors a summer symposium in southern California, at which mathematical problems basic to our work are discussed. Some of these problems concern the application of known results, but the greater part of the topics involve new research. Some of the special fields most frequently involved are matrix theory, statistics, combinatorial analysis, and logic.

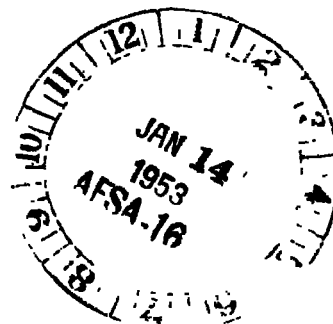





1. The Department of State completed a background investigation on SUBJECT 31 October 1945. During the course of this investigation Professor Miles L. Hanley of University of Wisconsin advised that SUBJECT was dogmatic, self-centered, and impossible for working with other people; that he recommended SUBJECT to the Linguistic Atlas in the Summer of 1931 and SUBJECT did not live up to expectations which caused SUBJECT's dismissal (according to employment records SUBJECT resigned); and that he did not question SUBJECT's loyalty to the U. S. Professor W. F. Twadell of University of Wisconsin advised that SUBJECT had a faulty personality and was very difficult for people to work with; that SUBJECT is overbearing and irritable; that SUBJECT was a leftist liberal like Henry Wallace; and that he did not question SUBJECT's loyalty to the U. S. Four other references gave favorable testimony concerning SUBJECT.

2. A favorable background investigation on SUBJECT was completed by the U. S. Air Force, Office of Special Investigations, on 5 September 1950. During the course of this investigation Professor Miles L. Hanley of University of Wisconsin (Note previous interview by State Department in 1945) advised that he has known SUBJECT for twenty-three years; that he considers SUBJECT to be honest, loyal to the U. S. government, discreet, industrious, financially reliable, and worthy of a position of trust. Three other references in the District of Columbia area recommended SUBJECT. SUBJECT's employment by the University of Toronto, Toronto, Canada, 1938 - 1942, was verified as satisfactory and it was determined that SUBJECT had no police record in Toronto.

3. The following information is extracted from Military District of Washington background investigation on SUBJECT, which was completed 11 December 1953:

a. SUBJECT attended the University of Wisconsin 1926 - 1931 and 1934 - 1938; received MA Degree in June 1935 and PhD Degree in March 1941. Employment by University of Wisconsin as a graduate assistant of German 1935 - 1938, as an associate professor of German 1946 - 1949, and as a full professor of German 1949 - 1953 was verified as satisfactory. Employment

at University of Michigan during Summers of 1947 and 1951, Federal employment by Signal Security Branch, Signal Service at Large, 26 August 1942 - 15 August 1946, and by U. S. Air Force Security Service 21 June 1949 - 26 August 1949, was also verified as satisfactory. Records of law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin, Michigan, Texas, and District of Columbia reflect no information concerning SUBJECT. SUBJECT has a good credit rating in Madison, Wisconsin, and Washington, D. C.

b. SUBJECT has been employed as a technical linguist by the American Council of Learned Societies, Washington, D. C., since February 1953. Dr. Mortimer Graves, Administrative Secretary of this Society, advised that he has known SUBJECT since 1942 or 1943 but was never closely associated with him until the present time; that he considers SUBJECT to be one of the top four or five linguists in the U. S.; that Subject's character and integrity are above question; that he is a loyal American; and that he would recommend SUBJECT. (Records of MDW reflect that Mortimer Graves has been connected with the American-Russian Institute, the Washington Committee for Aid to China, Washington Citizens Committee to Free Earl Browder, Washington Bookshop Association, and the Institute of Pacific Relations, all of which organizations have been cited as Communist fronts.)

c. The following information which reflects adversely on SUBJECT's discretion and suitability for NSA employment was developed:

- (1) Major Evelyn C. Brown, Language Research Branch, NSA, stated in substance that in her official capacity she contacted SUBJECT on 8 May 1953 at the American Council of Learned Societies; that this meeting lasted no longer than five minutes; that SUBJECT broached certain opinions concerning Communications Intelligence and tried to draw her out on the subject; that he showed knowledge of highly classified matters of NSA; that she is under the impression that SUBJECT was trying to impress her with his knowledge of NSA and its activities; that this discussion took place within hearing of several other persons; that SUBJECT made no effort to verify her connection with the NSA but accepted her at face value; and that she considers SUBJECT to be a security risk because of a lack of discretion and a desire to impress people with his knowledge.

- (2) Dr. Charles Rechenbach of NSA advised that he and SUBJECT were fellow employees at Arlington Hall Station from 1943 through 1945; that he was never intimately associated with SUBJECT; that he knows little regarding SUBJECT's background; that SUBJECT had always been difficult to get along with, was arrogant and uncooperative; that SUBJECT "has always been characterized by a somewhat overgrown ego"; that he had no knowledge of SUBJECT's return to D. C. until Major Brown's encounter with SUBJECT; that until Major Brown's report he had no reason to question SUBJECT's integrity or discretion that he could not recall any previous indiscretions on SUBJECT's part; that while employed at AHS he thought highly of SUBJECT's character and ability and considered him to be a loyal American; that if he had known that Major Brown was going to contact SUBJECT he would have gone himself because Major Brown was new to the Section; and that he has no reason to question SUBJECT's loyalty at the present time.
- (3) Mr. Frank Rowlett, now with Central Intelligence Agency, advised that he was SUBJECT's supervisor at AHS from 1942 to 1946; that SUBJECT did a very good job and at that time he would have recommended SUBJECT very highly for a position of trust; that since that time he has had reason to question SUBJECT's discretion because (1) SUBJECT made either implied or direct references to his previous work at AHS during a lecture before the American Linguistic Society, and (2) in an unclassified application for a position with the Air Force Security Service SUBJECT allegedly submitted classified information; that he is not able to recall more data concerning these incidents because they occurred three or four years ago; that SUBJECT is a very egotistical person whom people usually find hard to get along with; that he has no reason to question SUBJECT's loyalty to the U. S. and doubts that SUBJECT is interested in politics at all; that SUBJECT is aware of his own ability and desires recognition; that in this desire for recognition SUBJECT may become indiscreet and a security risk while trying to impress people with importance of positions which he has held; that SUBJECT lives in a different world than the "average" person and does not feel governed by accepted rules and regulations; that he has nothing derogatory concerning SUBJECT's character,

loyalty, or integrity, but in view of incidents mentioned above he feels that SUBJECT is a security risk and should not be given access to classified material. Mr. Rowlett further advised that the incident of SUBJECT divulging classified material during a lecture came to his attention through ASA channels and should be a matter of record.

d. Army Security Agency records of security violations and investigations for the period up to 1949 do not reflect any information concerning SUBJECT. The Official Civil Service 201 File on SUBJECT, maintained at Federal Records Center, St. Louis, Missouri, contains no derogatory information.

e. Thirteen additional persons knew of no adverse information concerning SUBJECT's loyalty, integrity, character, or discretion and recommended him for a position of trust. These thirteen consisted of the following:

- (1) Two persons who were acquainted with SUBJECT during his childhood in Alma Center, Wisconsin. They have had no prolonged contact with SUBJECT for fifteen or twenty years.
- (2) Two persons who have known SUBJECT since 1937 when they were fellow students at the University of Wisconsin, now employees of NSA, knew of nothing adverse concerning SUBJECT except that one felt SUBJECT boasted a little.
- (3) Dr. Henry Lee Smith, Jr., and Dr. George L. Trager, of the Foreign Service Institute, Department of State, who have known SUBJECT since 1941 and 1934 respectively, consider SUBJECT to be a stable, intelligent, loyal American with integrity and discretion.
- (4) Dr. Daniel Dribin, Chief of Training Supports Section, Office of Production, NSA, advised that he was associated with SUBJECT at AHS from latter part of 1942 to 1946; that he considers SUBJECT to be a brilliant, capable individual who is inclined to be superior in attitude; that he knows of no security violations on SUBJECT's part; that he does not consider him to be a security risk; and that he knows nothing derogatory regarding SUBJECT's character, loyalty, integrity, or discretion.

- (5) Four associates of SUBJECT on the faculty of University of Wisconsin, who have known SUBJECT since his undergraduate years, recommended SUBJECT. One of these persons, Thekla Nimmov, Secretary of German Department, further advised that SUBJECT was employed in D. C. during World War II and aided in deciphering the Japanese code; and that SUBJECT received the highest civilian medal from the U. S. Army for this work. Professor William T. Bandy further advised that SUBJECT was strong-willed, demanding, and had little patience with those less capable than himself.
- (6) Dr. Hans Kurath, Professor of English, University of Michigan, advised that he has been associated with SUBJECT since 1931; that SUBJECT was personable and well liked by all who knew him; that SUBJECT was definitely a loyal citizen; and that SUBJECT's character, morals, and integrity were above reproach.
- (7) Mr. Gordon Sommers, Consultant, U. S. Air Force Security Service, advised that he was slightly acquainted with SUBJECT from 1943 to 1947; that he worked with SUBJECT during the summer of 1949 at USAF Security Service, Brooks Air Force Base; that SUBJECT was a consultant to the Commanding Officer of USAF Security Service and his duties were of a highly classified and technical nature; that he knows nothing of SUBJECT's personal life, associates, organizational affiliations, or foreign connections; and that he does not question SUBJECT's honesty, moral character, discretion, or loyalty to the U. S.
